- KJV 1 Corinthians 16:17 I am glad of the coming of Stephanas and Fortunatus and Achaicus: for that which was lacking on your part they have supplied.
- TBT 1 Corinthians 16:17 χαίρω δὲ ἐπὶ τῇ παρουσίᾳ Στεφανᾶ καὶ Φουρτουνάτου καὶ Ἀχαικοῦ, ὅτι τὸ ὑμῶν ὑστέρημα οὗτοι ἀνεπλήρωσαν.

How would they be ever with the Lord?

- KJV 1 Thessalonians 4:17 Then we which are alive and remain shall be caught up together with them in the clouds, to meet the Lord in the air: and so shall we ever be with the Lord.
- TBT 1 Thessalonians 4:17 ἔπειτα ἡμεῖς οἱ ζῶντες, οἱ περιλειπόμενοι, ἅμα σὺν αὐτοῖς ἀρπαγησόμεθα ἐν νεφέλαις εἰς ἀπάντησιν τοῦ Κυρίου εἰς ἀέρα· καὶ οὕτω πάντοτε σὺν Κυρίῳ ἔσόμεθα.

“In this way”

- 20129 οὕτω(ς) an adverb from the near demonstrative οὗτος (this); in this manner, in this way, thus, so; (1) with reference to what preceded; (a) in combination with a correlative to produce a comparison (just) as . . . so (LU 11.30); (b) used absolutely to intensify what preceded thus, so, in this way (MT 11.26); (2) to refer to and introducing what follows as follows, in this way (MT 6.9); (3) before an adjective or adverb to denote degree of intensity so (RV 16.18)

“unclothed”

- KJV 2 Corinthians 5:4 For we that are in this tabernacle do groan, being burdened: not for that we would be unclothed, but clothed upon, that mortality might be swallowed up of life.
- TBT 2 Corinthians 5:4 καὶ γὰρ οἱ ὄντες ἐν τῷ σκῆνῃ στενάζομεν βαρούμενοι· ἐφ’ ᾧ οὐ θέλομεν ἐκδύσασθαι, ἀλλ’ ἐπενδύσασθαι, ἵνα καταποθῆ τὸ θνητὸν ὑπὸ τῆς ζωῆς.

KJV 2 Peter 3:15 And account that the longsuffering of our Lord is salvation; even as our beloved brother Paul also according to the wisdom given unto him hath written unto you;

TBT 2 Peter 3:15 καὶ τὴν τοῦ Κυρίου ἡμῶν μακροθυμίαν σωτηρίαν ἠγεῖσθε, καθὼς καὶ ὁ ἀγαπητὸς ἡμῶν ἀδελφὸς Παῦλος κατὰ τὴν αὐτῷ δοθεῖσαν σοφίαν ἔγραψεν ὑμῖν·

KJV **1 Peter 1:1** Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to the **strangers scattered** throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia,

TBT **1 Peter 1:1** Πέτρος, ἀπόστολος Ἰησοῦ Χριστοῦ, **ἐκλεκτοῖς παρεπιδήμοις διασπορᾶς** Πόντου, Γαλατίας, Καππαδοκίας, Ἀσίας, καὶ Βιθυνίας,

16610 κρείττων, ον, gen. ονος and κρείσσω comparative of κρατύς (strong) used as a comparative of ἀγαθός (good); (1) of persons superior, better, higher in rank (HE 1.4); substantively more important person (HE 7.7); (2) of what is more advantageous, better, more useful (1C 7.9); neuter as a substantive τὸ κρεῖττον the advantage, the more profitable thing (1C 11.17; perhaps HE 12.24), opposite τὸ ἥσσον (the worse); τὰ κρείσσωνα more useful things (HE 6.9); (3) neuter as an adverb (in a) better (way) (probably HE 12.24)
