

THE BODY OF CHRIST



CAIN WAS A TILLER OF THE GROUND

- As a member of Adam's household Cain should be a keeper (shamar) of the ground as well as a "tiller" (adar).
- KJV Genesis 2:5 And every plant of the field before it was in the earth, and every herb of the field before it grew: for the LORD God had not caused it to rain upon the earth, and there was not a man to till the ground. (Gen. 2:5 KJV)
- KJV Genesis 2:15 And the LORD God took the man, and put him into the garden of Eden to loss it and to keep it. (Gen. 2:15 KJV)

CAIN

- Meaning: n pr m Cain = "possession" 1) eldest son of Adam and Eve and the first murderer having murdered his brother Abel n pr gent Kenite = "smiths" 2) the tribe from which the father-in-law of Moses was a member and which lived in the area between southern Palestine and the mountains of Sinai

CAIN

- He confused works for service with that of the gift by grace
- He compartmentalized his life. He took what he was specially (a tiller) and did not keep the responsibility of the ground and its progeny
