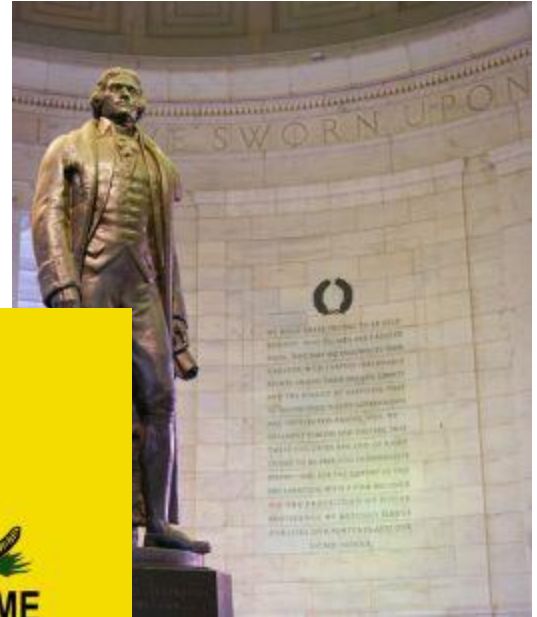
Deuteronomy (where does the name come from?)

- 17:18 And it shall be, when he sitteth upon the throne of his kingdom, that he shall write him a copy of this law in a book out of that which is before the priests the Levites:

Limited Government (Thomas Jefferson – Decl. of Independence)

- "We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable Rights, that among these are Life, Liberty and the pursuit of Happiness. — That to secure these rights, Governments are instituted among Men, deriving their just powers from the consent of the governed, — That whenever any Form of Government becomes destructive of these ends, it is the Right of the People to alter or to abolish it, and to institute new Government, laying its foundation on such principles and organizing its powers in such form, as to them shall seem most likely to effect their Safety and Happiness."

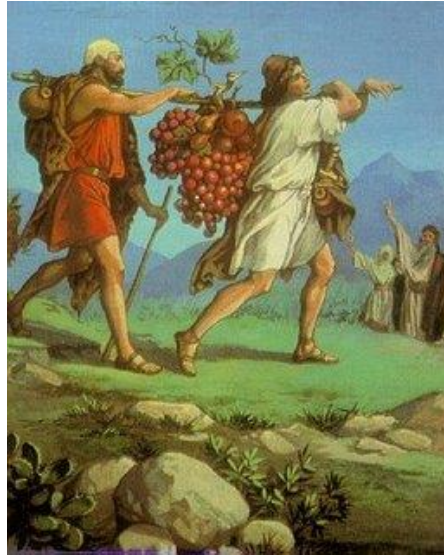

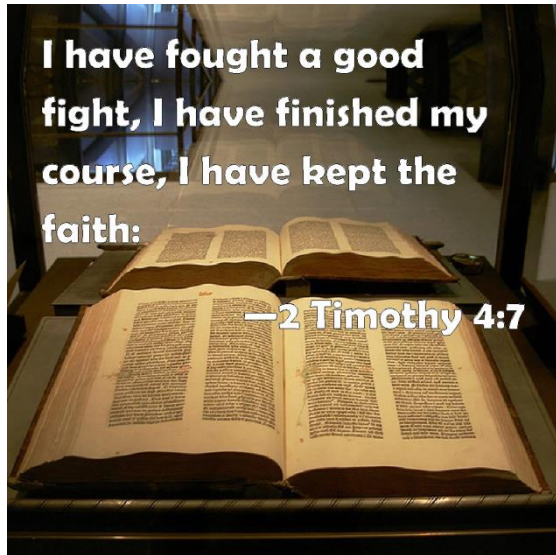

Perfection or Perdition?

- ^{KJG} **Hebrews 6:1** Therefore leaving the principles of the doctrine of Christ, let us go on unto perfection; not laying again the foundation of repentance from dead works, and of faith toward God,
- ^{KJG} **Hebrews 10:39** But we are not of them who draw back unto perdition; but of them that believe to the saving of the soul. (Heb 10:39 KJG)

If indeed God permit

- ^{KJG} **Hebrews 6:3** And this will we do, **if God permit.**
- ^{TBT} **Hebrews 6:3** καὶ τοῦτο ποιήσομεν, **ἐάνπερ ἐπιτρέπη ὁ Θεός.**

Beware ... Lest ... prophets

- ^{KJG} **Acts 13:40** Beware therefore, lest that come upon you, which is spoken of in the prophets;
